The French National Orchestra of Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes is organizing a musical and immersive tour in the United States of America April-May of 2025 to celebrate the bicentennial of Marquis de Lafayette's travels, 50 years after the war of Independence. The tour will focus on the key cities and landmarks of Lafayette's visit in 1825.

The orchestra will be led by conductor Thomas Zehetmair and the concert's program will be related to Lafayette's story and the time period of his tour. An immersive sound & light experience at the beginning of the concert will retrace the Marquis' travels and incredible story.

# About Lafayette

A major-general in the American army at the age of 20, and a friend of Washington who treated him like a son, Lafayette was a true hero, contributing to the insurgents' military successes, including the capture of Yorktown in 1781. He travelled back to the United States in 1824-1825 as part of an official invitation of thanks by the country he helped to gain freedom. He is regarded as one of the most important characters in the American War of Independence and Franco-American History.
